HOPE HOUSE 1 and 2 UPDATE FROM LUZ MARINA:

The past number of months brought us many blessings that came through people like you. We give thanks for:

1. Provision of computers for boys and girls, thus facilitating schoolwork.
2. Cameras and headphones for each of our boys and girls, complementing the resources for access to classes.
3. Protection for all the staff of Hope Home in the midst of the difficulties we are experiencing at this time.
4. We have grown in followers in our social networks and more people have met and fallen in love with this project that cultivates the dreams of the boys and girls of Colombia.

Three weeks of school holidays have just ended. However, the children had to stay in both the Hope 1 and 2 Houses due to Covid-19 restrictions. We did ensure that they had a fun and different time. They participated every day in activities at home and in the park with games, evenings, cooking, sports competitions, experiments, and of course rest.

We continue teaching at the homes, with the purpose of guaranteeing that everyone in the Home can be protected. Thanks to the support of our donors, we already have the resources so that this type of study can be carried out without difficulties.



Luz Marina shared another lovely story regarding two of the boys in Hope House 1 being able recently to visit both their sisters in Hope House 2. The adage that a picture is better than a thousand words is certainly true in this occasion!



JUAN REY PROJECT UPDATE:

The Juan Rey project continues to support underprivileged families in the community and at the Cultural Centre since the necessary bio security protocols have been put in place. The programme includes providing food and education and teaching God's Word. Many of the children have no school classes currently due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. In addition to this, poor families are supported in the community by providing food, education and counselling for mental health issues.

The following are some slides sent from the Juan Rey Project Team helps to visualise their very effective work:

A family with little hope

Sofia, the mother, used to be mistreated and abandoned. She was always looking for love and acceptance.

But suffering disappointment time after time.

Ana, the eldest daughter, is 10 years old. She is growing up in a difficult environment and taking care of her younger sister.

While the mother goes out to work and be able to pay the rent and make enough to survive day by day.

Natasha, who is 7 years old, is in second grade. Through the support she receives from the project she is learning to read.

The three of them live in one room in a house where many other people live. Without any kind of comfort or safety.

They only have their own beds and clothes.

They are supported by the project in the following areas:

- Accompaniment face-to-face to do homework, since they do not have the tools to study at home.
 - Psychological counselling
 - Food

Let us pray: That God will supply for their affective, economic and above all, spiritual needs and that they will believe in Christ's salvation and love.

Thank you for your continuing prayer and financial support helping us to help boys and girls in Bogotá, Colombia who are often described as 'the last, the least and the lost'.
